SECTION 1: AFRIKAANS & ENGLISH

Poësie

Formele Poësie Eie Keuse - Deelnemers kies 'n gedig (nie in Vinatix se sillabus beskikbaar nie). Die gedig moet gepas wees vir die deelnemer se ouderdom en word as 'n stilstaande gedig voorgedra met skoolklere of formele drag. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.

Selfgeskrewe Poësie - Deelnemers skryf hul eie gedig om voor te dra, hierdie item word stilstaande voorgedra met skoolklere of formele drag. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.

Lees

Voorbereide Lees* - Deelnemers kies 'n gepaste storie om voor te lees. Dit moet van toepassing wees op die deelnemer se graad. Deelnemers moet voorbereid wees. Daar word nie van deelnemers verwag om die leesstuk te ken nie. Tydlimiet: 90 sekondes.

Onvoorbereide Lees* - Leesstof sal per e-pos gestuur word. Hierdie item word stilstaande of sittende in skoolklere of formele drag gelewer. Tydlimiet: 90 sekondes.

Spelling

Daar word van deelnemers verwag om 5 woorde korrek te spel. 'n Stemopname van 5 woorde sal per e-pos gestuur word. Die woorde sal op ouderdom van toepassing wees. Hierdie item word in skoolklere of formele drag gelewer.



Redenaars

Die aanbieding van 'n toespraak wat die luisterraar direk aanspreek, inlig, beïnvloed of vermaak. 'n Toespraak bestaan uit 'n inleiding, ten minste drie standpunte met goedgekeurde bronverwysings, tydskrif, koerant, internet ens. asook 'n slot.

Voorbereide Redenaars - Hierdie item word in skoolklere aangebied. Slegs handgebare word toegelaat, geen fisiese beweging word toegelaat nie. Tydlimiet: 7 minute.

Onvoorbereide Redenaars - Temas word per e-pos aan deelnemers gestuur. Toesprake word gelewer in skoolklere of formele drag en slegs handgebare word toegelaat, geen fisiese beweging word toegelaat nie. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.

Limeriek (Voorgeskrewe, Eie Keuse of Selfgeskrewe)

Voorgeskrewe limerieke is in die sillabus aangeteken. Eie keuse, deelnemers kan enige item van hul keuse voordra, mits dit van toepassing is op hul ouderdom. Hierdie item word voorgedra in swart klere of formele drag. Tydlimiet: 3 minute. Limeriek- Selfgeskrewe, deelnemers skryf hul eie limeriek om voor te dra, hierdie item word stilstaande voorgedra met skoolklere of formele drag. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.

Eie Keuse

Enige items wat nie onder die Afrikaanse Afdeling beskikbaar is nie. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.



Poetry

Prescribed Poetry - All poems are available in the syllabus. Participants must memorize the poem and recite it

Formal Poetry Own Choice - Participants choose their own poem, not available on www.vinatix.co.za. The poem must be appropriate for the participant's age and is presented as a stationary poem with school clothes or formal wear. No physical movement is allowed. Time limit: 3 minutes.

Self-written Poetry - Participants perform a poem that they have written themselves. This item should be presented in school clothes or formal wear. Time limit: 3 minutes.

Reading

Prepared Reading * - Participants choose their own reading material in the form of a story. However, this passage should apply to their age and grade. This item is delivered stationary or sitting in school clothes or formal wear. Time limit: 90 seconds.

Unprepared Reading * - Reading material will be emailed. This item is delivered stationary or sitting in school clothes or formal wear. Time limit: 90 seconds.

Spelling Bee

Participants are expected to spell 5 words correctly, a voice recording will be emailed. These words will apply to age. This item is delivered in school clothes or formal wear. Time limit: 5 minutes.

Public Speaking

The presentation of a speech where an individual speaker directly addresses an audience to inform, influence or entertain them. A speech consists of an introduction, at least 3 views with approved source references (magazine, newspaper, internet etc.) as well as a conclusion.

Prepared Public Speaking -

Item is presented in school clothes. Only hand gestures are allowed, no physical movement is allowed. Any appropriate theme may be used. Time limit: 7 minutes.

Unprepared Public Speaking -

Themes will be provided via email. Speeches are delivered in school clothes and only hand gestures are allowed, no physical movement is allowed. Time limit: 3 minutes

Limerick (Prescribed, Own Choice or Self Written)

Prescribed limericks are included in the syllabus. Own Choice limericks, participants choose any limerick (not listed below). The item must be appropriate for the participant's age and also be presented with black clothing, school clothes or formal attire. Time limit: 3 minutes. Self-Written Limerick, participants perform a limerick that they have written themselves. This item should be presented stationary with school clothes or formal wear. Time limit: 3 minutes.

Own Choice

Any items not available under the English Section Syllabus. Time limit: 3 minutes.

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SECTION 2: DRAMA AFR & DRAMA ENG

Prosa

Gedramatiseerde Poësie (Epies, Liries, Kletsrym of Verhalend)

Daar is geen vasgestelde temas nie. Deelnemers kan enige item van hul keuse voordra, mits dit van toepassing is op hul ouderdom. Hierdie item word voorgedra in swart klere of formele drag. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.

Improvisasie

Deelnemers gebruik hul verbeelding om 'n stroie te skep. Temas word per epos gestuur. Hierdie item word in swart klere of formele drag gelewer. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.

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Eie Keuse

Enige items wat nie onder die Afrikaanse Afdeling beskikbaar is nie. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.

Monoloog

Voorbereide Monoloog (Klassiek, Komies, Dramaties, Musiekblyspel of Bybel) -

Deelnemers kies hul eie monoloog wat hul vooraf voorberei het, om voor te dra. Hierdie monoloog moet egter van toepassing wees op die deelnemer se ouderdom. Tydlimiet: 3 minute. Hierdie item word in swart klere of formele drag gelewer.

Onvoorbereide Monoloog (Klassiek, Komies, Dramaties, Musiekblyspel of Bybel) -

Temas word per e-pos gestuur. Hierdie item word in swart klere of formele drag gelewer. Tydlimiet: 3 minute.



Advertisie

Voorbereide Advertisie - Kies 'n advertensie (vooraf voorberei) om voor te dra. Moet van toepassing wees op ouderdom. Geen vasgestelde kleredrag nie. Tydlimiet: 5 minute.

Onvoorbereide Advertisie - Temas sal per e-pos gestuur word. Geen vasgestelde kleredrag nie. Tydlimiet: 5 minute.

Mimiek

Voorbereide Mimiek - Slegs gebare. Geen dialoog. Word voorgedra in swart klere of formele mimiek drag. Tydlimiet: 2 minute.

Onvoorbereide Mimiek - Temas sal per e-pos gestuur word. Slegs gebare. Geen dialoog. Word in swart klere of formele mimiek drag gelewer. Tydlimiet: 2 minute.

Prose

Religious or Dramatized - There are no set themes for this item. Participants can present any topic of their choice, provided it is applicable to their age. This item is presented in black clothing or formal wear. Time limit: 3 Minutes.

Informal Poetry

There are no set themes for this item. Participants can choose any poem to perform, provided it applies to their age and grade. This item is presented in black clothing or formal wear. Time limit: 3 Minutes.

Dramatized Poetry (Epic, Lyrical, Slam or Narrative)

Participants choose their own poem (not available on Vinatix's website). The poem must be appropriate for the participant's age and also be presented with black clothing or formal attire. Time limit: 3 Minutes.

Improvisation

Participants immerse themselves in a story. Themes will be emailed, whereafter a video should be emailed to us. Performed in black or formal attire. Time limit: 3 Minutes.



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Monologue

Prepared Monologue Classical, Comical, Dramatic, Broadway or Religious - Participants choose their own monologue for presentation. However, this monologue should apply to the participant's age and grade. This item is delivered in black clothing or formal wear. Time limit: 3 Minutes.

Unprepared Monologue Classical, Comical, Dramatic, Broadway or Religious - Themes for the unprepared monologue will be emailed. This item is performed in black attire or formal wear. Time limit: 3 Minutes.

Own Choice

Any item not provided above. Participants choose their own theme; however, it should apply to their age. Time limit: 3 minutes.

Vocal

Time limit: 3 minutes for all items.
Kindly refer to the website to view the various items available to enter for under the vocal section.

Backtrack refers to a CD or a digital recording medium.

Own accompaniment can be in the form of any musical instrument.

A Capella refers to singing without instrumental accompaniment.


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Instrumental

Solo Performance Piano Item - A single person telling a story with the use of music. Any music item performed by playing the piano. Time limit: 3 minutes.

Own Choice - Any music item performed by playing any other musical instrument, not listed in the Vinatix Eisteddfod Syllabus. Time limit: 3 minutes.



Ballet

(Classical or Dramatized) Set Solo, Solo, Duo, Trio or Group - A dance form that originated in Italy during the Renaissance. Characterized by graceful movements and the use of pointe shoes with reinforced toes. Participants provide their own music. Time limit solo items: 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.



Ballroom

A formal social dance performed as a solo item or in couples.

Jive, Slow Style, Samba, Cha-Cha, Tango or Waltz (Solo, Duo, Trio or Group) - Participants should provide their own music. There is a time limit of 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.

Tap

(Set Solo, Solo, Duo, Trio or Group) - Dance performed wearing shoes fitted with metal taps, characterized by rhythmical tapping of the toes and heels. Participants should provide their own music. Time limit solo items: 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.

Hip-Hop

Street dance styles performed to hip-hop music. This dance form includes a wide range of styles. Set Solo, Solo, Duo, Trio or Group Participants should provide their own music. Time limit solo items: 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.

House or Straight (Solo, Duo, Trio or Group) - Participants should provide their own music. Time limit solo items: 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.

Modern

(Set Solo, Solo, Duo, Trio or Group) - Expressive style of dancing that developed as a reaction to classical ballet. Can include speech and film. Participants should provide their own music. Time limit solo items: 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.

Any Other

Acrobatics, Musical Theatre, Contemporary/Lyrical, Bhangra, Energy, Jazz, Paso or Spanish

Participants should provide their own music. Time limit solo items: 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.

Own Choice Set Solo, Solo, Duo,

Trio or Group - Any dance item not listed above. Participants should provide their own music. Time limit solo items: 2 minutes. Time limit for group items: 4 minutes.
